Why Belfast and Dublin?

The Republic of Ireland and Northern Ireland present a prime case study on the consequences of miscommunication, which you'll discover as you compare the culture of Belfast to daily life in Dublin. Learn about the history of the two sides' troubles and their territorial, religious, and political conflicts in the places where people lived through them.

Days 1-3: Belfast | Derry

Fly overnight to Belfast and meet your Tour Director before beginning your journey in a capital city that's been shaped by social and political tensions. Visit the Titanic Belfast, a maritime monument devoted to one of the most writtenabout subjects of all time: the *Titanic*. Experience more of Northern Ireland during an excursion to Giant's Causeway—ancient rock formations comprised of thousands of 55-million-year-old hexagonal basalt columns. On your way back to Belfast, stop for a guided tour of Derry.

DUBLIN

Day 4: Belfast | Dublin

Take an expertly guided tour of Belfast, a city in transition, and learn how it's redefining itself after a period of political and religious strife in the 1970s and 1980s. Visit Lower Falls and Shankill Road, and view moving political murals that help tell the story of The Troubles. Hear more about Northern Ireland's governing bodies and relationship with the royal family during stops at Hillsborough Castle and Stormont Parliament Building. Continue on to Dublin that afternoon.

Days 5-6: Dublin

While walking the streets where Dublin's revolution took place, learn about the city's tumultuous history leading up to the partition of Ireland in 1922. Visit St. Patrick's Cathedral and Trinity College, where you can view the *Book of Kells—a* calligraphic manuscript created by Irish monks over 1,000 years ago. Test your athleticism as you play one of Ireland's Gaelic games, which are an expression of Irish identity. Attend the GPO Witness History Exhibition to experience the events of the 1916 Easter Rising from the witnesses' perspective. You'll round out your stay in Dublin by spending some time at Causey Farm, where you can try your hand at making brown bread, take a traditional *céili* dancing lesson, and learn more about customs and life in Ireland.

Day 7: Zurich | Davos

Fly from Dublin to Zurich on your way to Davos. Located in Graubünden, the innovative mountainside town is where your three-day leadership conference will take place.



Days 8-10: Leadership Conference

Enjoy a scenic cable car ride and a bit of free time to explore Davos before the conference kicks off on Friday night. You'll engage in some friendly competition with other Summit attendees, and be encouraged to step outside your comfort zone as you get to know the team you will work with over the next few days. On Saturday, the leadership conference continues as you collaborate with students from across North America and the world in this inspiring setting. Over the course of the entire weekend, you'll hear from world-renowned speakers, converse with local and global experts, and work in small international teams to harness *The Power of Communication*. The event will strengthen your creativity and critical thinking skills as you use design thinking to develop solutions that improve the way the world communicates.

Day 11: Depart for home

Head to the Zurich airport ready to address local challenges and initiate meaningful conversations back home.
