Days 1-5: London

Fly overnight to London and meet your Tour Director—then begin your journey in a city of 8 million people, where you'll experience thriving technology and music scenes and see hundreds of years of history come to life. Admire the Baroque domes and spires of St. Paul's Cathedral, check out the lively five-way intersection of Piccadilly Circus, and snap a picture of Big Ben from the banks of the River Thames. You'll have the opportunity to explore either London's Science Museum or its Wellcome Collection: a museum founded by Sir Henry Wellcome, whose passion for medicine led him to collect over one million objects.

Of course, London is more than just museums and cathedrals. It's also home to groundbreaking innovation. Spend some time at Bletchley Park with an expert local guide. Once the top-secret home of the World War II Codebreakers, learn how their efforts to penetrate the secret communications of the Axis Powers impacted the outcome of the war. Visit the National Museum of Computing and hear the remarkable story of Colossus, the world's first electronic computer that helped decipher messages between Hitler and his generals.

You'll go to Speakers' Corner in the northeast corner of Hyde Park—known as the home of free speech—where public speaking, debate, and discussions happen daily. Watch how it's done before you and the members of your group are invited to make your voices heard. Take part in a cultural exchange activity with locals, and spend an evening at the theatre before continuing on to Switzerland.

Day 6: Zurich | Davos

Fly through Zurich on your way to Davos. Located in Graubünden, the innovative mountainside town is where your three-day leadership conference will take place.

Days 7-9: Leadership Conference

Enjoy a scenic cable car ride and a bit of free time to explore Davos before the conference kicks off on Friday night. You'll engage in some friendly competition with other Summit attendees, and be encouraged to step outside your comfort zone as you get to know the team you will work with over the next few days. On Saturday, the leadership conference continues as you collaborate with students from across North America and the world in this inspiring setting. Over the course of the entire weekend, you'll hear from world-renowned speakers, converse with local and global experts, and work in small international teams to harness *The Power of Communication*. The event will strengthen your creativity and critical thinking skills as you use design thinking to develop solutions that improve the way the world communicates.

Day 10: Depart for home

Head to the Zurich airport ready to address local challenges and initiate meaningful conversations back home.
