What you'll experience on your tour

Day 1: Fly to Ecuador

- Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Quito, the Ecuadorian capital carved into a narrow plateau high above the Andean valleys, beneath the peaks of the Pichincha Volcano. On your guided sightseeing tour, explore the colonial quarter of Quito, where wrought-iron balconies and majestic stone pillars grace 300-year-old plazas, churches, and palaces. The area was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1978. See Independence Plaza and the Government Palace, and visit the Dominican Santo Domingo Church. Then, visit the Intiñan Museum, which explores how the Incas determined the middle of the Earth. Pose for a photo on the equator, the namesake of Ecuador. If you've ever wanted to stand in both hemispheres at the same time, this is your chance.

Day 2: Quito

- Take a tour of Quito: Independence Plaza; Government Palace.
- Visit the Santo Domingo Monastery.
- Take an excursion to the equatorial line.
- Visit the Intiñan Museum.

Day 3: Riobamba

- Travel to Riobamba.
- Participate in cultural immersion activities.

Day 4: Riobamba | Ingapirca | Cuenca

- Enjoy a ride on the Nariz del Diablo train.
- Enjoy a local performance.
- Visit the Ingapirca ruins.
- Continue to Cuenca, the colonial jewel of the south and Ecuador's third largest city. Declared a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1999, Cuenca's historic area is a neat grid of cobblestone streets and whitewashed buildings. But the city also embraces modern life, which you will discover at its cafés, galleries, and shops.

Day 5: Cuenca

- Take a Tour Director-led walking tour of Cuenca, where you'll see the Old Cathedral, New Cathedral, and the flower market.
- Enjoy dinner with local families.

Day 6: Cuenca

- Enjoy an interactive experience with a local community outside of Cuenca.
- Participate in a salsa dance lesson.

Day 7: Guayaguil

- Visit Cajas National Park.
- Visit a cocoa plantation.
- Travel to Guayaquil.
- Transfer to the airport for your overnight flight home.

Day 8: Puerto Lopez

- Travel via the Ruta del Spondylus to Los Frailes Beach and Puerto López, a small fishing village set against the warm waters of the Pacific that is renowned for its friendly atmosphere and biological diversity. Most famously, it is the headquarters of Ecuador's Machalilla National Park, whose reach includes Isla de la Plata just off the coast of Puerto López. You'll visit this former pirate hideout, which today has been described as the "Poor Man's Galápagos." As you explore the island's rugged geography, you'll meet a number of creatures known to nhabit the Galápagos, including the bluefooted booby and the albatross. In its coral reef, you'll get the chance to snorkel with a wide, colorful array of fish. Make sure to bring your camera.

Day 9: Puerto Lopez

- Enjoy a boat ride to Machalilla National Park.
- Take an expertly guided tour of Isla de la Plata.
- Snorkel off Isla de la Plata.

Day 10: Dos Mangas | Guayaquil

- Take an expertly guided tour of Dos Mangas.
- Hike in the coastal rainforest.
- Enjoy lunch with the local community.
- See a handicraft-making workshop.
- Travel to Guayaquil.
- Transfer to the airport for your overnight flight home.

Day 11: Arrive home
