Day 1: Fly overnight to Italy

Day 2: Rome | Naples region

Meet your Tour Director at the airport in Rome and journey south to Ostia Antica, the ruins of an ancient Roman seaport. Here you will have the opportunity to explore the well-preserved archaeological site and imagine what life was like in the 4th century B.C. Then continue on to Italy's Naples region.

Day 3: Naples region

Spend the morning among grazing buffaloes as you explore a working buffalo mozzarella farm. Learn how this cheese is produced and sample some of the savory treats. Back in the city, enjoy an expert-led tour of Naples' historic center. Then head underground to Galleria Borbonica, where you'll don spelunking helmets and wander through the tunnels of the city's aqueduct system from the 15th and 16th centuries. Dinner tonight will be the final products from a pizza-making class—Naples is where this famous dish was first created.

Day 4: Pompeii | Rome

Start your day off at the ruins of Pompeii. Following the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 A.D., day-to-day life in the resort town of Pompeii was suddenly frozen in time beneath ash—making it one of the richest archaeological sites in the world. Then head north to Rome, the capital city of Italy. Tonight, enjoy a fraschetta dinner, where Italian cuisine and Roman flair come together deliciously in a casual setting.

Day 5: Rome

Discover what it took to become a Roman gladiator during a hands-on lesson this morning. Dress in traditional gladiator garb, and learn what life was like for these historic Italian figures. From there, explore the world's most famous arena, the Colosseum, where you can almost hear the stamping feet of the crowds gathered for gladiatorial combat. Learn about everyday life in ancient Rome as you walk among the ruins of the Roman Forum, where Julius Caesar gave many of his great political speeches. Continue your adventure in Rome on a self-guided walking tour to see other important sites such as the Trevi Fountain, Pantheon, Piazza Navona, and the Spanish Steps.

Day 6: Rome

Explore the beautiful Villa Borghese gardens on a guided bike tour. At the Museo Leonardo Da Vinci, step inside the world of the Italian Renaissance master and participate in many of the hands-on activities there.

Day 7: Rome

On your expert-led tour of Vatican City, be sure to look up at Michelangelo's breathtaking ceiling in the Sistine Chapel and check out the colorful uniforms of the Swiss Guard, protectors of the Vatican. Then opt to join a gelato-making workshop, where you can try your hand at making the delicious Italian-style ice cream.
